

BRIEF MEETING SUMMARY

Committee informed of ongoing partnership with Wilson College to offer a Surgical Tech Associates of Science degree. This will benefit Allied Health students by providing an additional career pathway in addition to earning 14 college credits and securing post-secondary admission at Wilson. Committee also discussed recent consortium proposal by Career Tech to local long-term care facilities to provide a centralized CNA training program to better meet the needs of our community.
