The Franklin County Career & Technology Center (FCCTC/CareerTech) Pennsylvania K-12 Guidance Plan for our students in grades 10th through 12th grades, has been updated in accordance with PA Chapter 339.31. The K-12 Guidance Plan is a required document by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania as part of 22 Pa. Code §339. Chapter 339 mandates that all school districts and career and technology centers (CTCs) produce evidence of a K-12 Guidance Plan. The Plan must include specific strategies for students, educators, and parents to become aware of their local CTC, its programs of study, and resources available. The Plan is to ensure that school districts and CTCs deliver the Academic Standards for Career Education and Work (CEW) across grade levels to help students make informed career decisions and prepare them for the workforce.

2. Role of the School Counselor: ASCA

They are certified professionals whose education provides us with the unique qualifications to address the academic, personal/social, and career service needs of the FCCTC students. It is important that the school counselor is supported by adhering to their professional code of ethics. As a profession, Pennsylvania Counselors abide by the ethical standards for School Counselors as per by the American School Counselors Association and the Pennsylvania School Counselors Association. The school counselor's main focus is the career, as well as the academic and social/emotional domain. They provide support services to all FCCTC students, staff, and sending school districts.

Role	Level	Evidence of Role
Leader	High School	As a Leader – They use leadership effectively and efficiently to create, implement, and manage a counseling program that seeks to encourage and empower students to make productive and successful decisions. They use leadership in creating collaborative relationships among stakeholders. They work closely with the school principal as the core in forming leadership collaboration that fosters a school climate for increasing student educational and career outcomes. Some other examples of leadership: SAP Coordinator, NTHS Coordinator, Franklin County Counselor Meeting Facilitator, new program creator and facilitator (dual enrollment, highlighting student programs, etc.), parent conference/IEP representative, designing and implementing the counseling program, ensuring the K-12 Plan is provided to all equally, K-12 Comprehensive Plan Coordinator, Financial Aid/Scholarship/Classroom Workshop Coordinator, and supervision of the Counselor Assistant and Student Coordinator.
Advocate	High School	As an Advocate – They advocate for students, for the counseling profession and for agents of improvement. The focus is to impact and empower our students to find educational and career opportunities through the academic, personal/social, and career service program. They do this by becoming a voice for our students, and sometimes more heavily for those who are underserved, underprivileged, and socio-economically disadvantaged. A few examples of the role as an advocate are: helping all students feel safe by

		enforcing school policies, finding financial resources to help underserved students enroll in CHS or to purchase program uniforms/materials, working with all students by educating students to help themselves and others regarding bullying and suicide situations, responding to the needs of students while in crisis, assessing the need for internal and external mental health referrals when appropriate, identifying community resources and building partnerships that can help student achievement, threat assessment team member, intervening prior to discipline issues or counseling after discipline issues.
Collaborator	High School	As a Collaborator - They collaborate and team with our students, teachers, administrators, parents, community, business members, post-secondary partners, and sending school educators for our students' academic, personal/social, and career success. This secures successful learning in a solution focused environment. This includes coordination and management of the components of our delivery system services. They have established a referral system that utilizes resources offered by the school and community and ensures the privacy of the student. In addition to our counseling plan, a few examples of the role as a collaborator are: SAP Coordinator, Perkins Committee Member, HACC and Penn College CHS Coordinator/Point of Contact, Articulation Agreement Coordinator, Parent Conference Coordination, and Franklin County Counselor Meeting Coordinator.
Systemic Change Agent	High School	As a Systemic Change Agent - They suggest improvement and follow through when needed. Examples include consulting with administration to foster needed program changes, and providing mental health counseling including follow through with services for individual/family needs.

- Have a willingness to cooperate with the FCCTC administration, faculty, staff, and student body.

- Maintain the confidentiality, both verbally and in written form, of each student's educational record.
- Strive to maintain and improve professional competence.
- Take necessary precautions to protect students, equipment, materials, and facilities.

Specific Duties and Responsibilities

- Provide all socio-emotional counseling for non-CASD students. Work with student individually/collaboratively to find solutions to problems including mediation/counseling/coordination of services/parent-home school interventions.
- Provide career and technical specific support for Post-Secondary preparation for students.
 - <u>SOAR</u> Responsible for updating the statewide articulations student packets for each program.
 - <u>Direct Articulations</u> Assist instructors set up and maintain direct articulations. Liaison with colleges on an on-going basis.
 - <u>College in the High School</u> Manage dual enrollment programs for HACC, HCC, and Penn College.
 - NOCTI Recommended College Credits Update the NOCTI credit options.
 - <u>Scholarships</u> Review scholarship information throughout the year. Meet with students about opportunities.
 - <u>National Technical Honor Society Advisor</u> Determine candidates for NTHS nomination, conduct assembly, enroll students, order graduation materials, and organize awards for ceremony (2X per year).
- Provide crisis counseling in emergency situations by adopting the appropriate solutions/interventions.
- Coordinate and oversee the maintenance of student records including grade monitoring or parent contact. Maintain confidential anecdotal record, SOAR, and IEP documents.
- Coordinate any SAP (Student Assistance Program) referrals to the appropriate school district SAP liaison.
- Attend any IEP meetings for current and potential students as designated by the administration.
- Assist with (NSO) New Student Orientation and participate in the event.
- Meet with students to complete Career Objective Reporting (PDE REQUIRED) form and assure all necessary information is included and reported.
- Provide quarterly Franklin County counselor meeting with sending schools to communicate all FCCTC information and professional learning community.
- Required to have a fall and spring OAC meetings. Organize the meetings, extend invites, conduct meetings and complete minutes.
- Coordinate the collection and assessment of graduate follow up placement data.
- Coordinate HACC, Penn College and Thaddeus Stevens visits for interested students twice/year.
- Schedule Post-Secondary School and Military visits with classrooms, LGI, and cafeteria. College and Educator Summary Report is required on a yearly basis.
- Ensure the counseling portion of 339 regulations are being followed. Responsible for carrying out plan the FCCTC Guidance Plan. Updated yearly to reflect any and all changes within the counseling section.
- Promote the development of high standards of conduct and success within the student body and foster healthy school environment conducive to learning.

- Support administrative staff by implementing the Student & Community Engagement Plan, School Counseling Plan.
- Manage and maintain the Guidance Office budget.
- Keep administration informed of all activities and report illegal acts, inappropriate behavior, and student issues.

What grade will the Plan and Portfolio Start?	Each student plan begins in 10 th grade and the Portfolio begins in 11 th grade at FCCTC. Some teachers choose to have their students begin creating their portfolio in 10 th grade. Sending school may begin the student's portfolio in elementary school

We begin the career planning process during the first month of school when we meet in the classroom of each program for the first planning session in a group format. With all 10th, 11th, and 12th grade students, we discuss what will be accomplished over the year and provide important information such as SAT dates, the SAT prep guide, the Financial Aid planner, the Scholarship listing, and earning college credits in high school opportunities. We review the website and learn about the career plan, how to create the portfolio, and what should be in the portfolio. The next session is also as a group in the computer lab by class with all 10th grade students to begin the career plan form and take the Career Cruising Interest, Skills, and Learning Styles assessment. The next step is individual planning for each student which occurs towards the end of the semester for each 10th grade student. These sessions occur to review the assessments, determine/confirm the career path, file in the career portfolio, and cover all career topics listed below on the template below. The 11th grade sessions are held mid-semester and cover all areas listed on the template below. The 12th grade sessions are held at the beginning of the semester. The career plan is in hard copy that we complete each year and is expected to be built upon as students are exposed to skills and experiences through the years. The career portfolios are created in the classroom beginning in 11th grade and are mostly in hard copy while some instructors utilize electronic versions. The files are maintained by students, instructors, and counselors combined.

We use Career Cruising for all individual career assessments for each 10th grade student. It is also used for post-secondary research, industry research, and career research. For a deeper assessment, we use CareerScope for a different description of career recommendations for a student needing further career direction while in any grade. In our career sessions we utilize the career plan to discuss areas such as courses completed, scheduling future courses, goals for the year, review of sports, honors, accomplishments, and activities. We discuss the value of certifications obtaining in the classroom, membership in a CTSO, as well as work and shadowing experiences. We discuss options after high school that best suits the student's needs and the steps needed to accomplish that post-secondary goal. We talk about post-secondary schools, different testing including SAT testing, military, scholarships and make plans to apply, schedule shadowing, visiting schools, and/or employers. These conversations lead to better resume revisions that are included in the career portfolio located in the classroom. Other items in the career portfolio are an example application, mock interview materials, thank you letter, certifications, and project pictures.

The career plan provides a basis to build and monitor student's objectives regarding academic, career, and personal goals. The sessions provide students with information and documents needed to share with parents to collectively accomplish tasks such as registering for SAT's, applying for financial aid, completing scholarship applications, and applying for employment. Information such as scholarship listings and college credit acquisition while in high school is listed on the FCCTC website. In addition, we have FCCTC student information listed on the website for families to review and we review student career planning information with families at new student orientations and open houses.

We meet with instructors prior to conducting individual career sessions to discuss areas such as the level of student, recommendations for students, competencies completed, certifications, and concerns. This ensures career sessions are productive and suited for the level of each student. The instructors receive a copy of the assessment and learning styles of each student to assist in understanding each student on an individual basis.

The career plan is built upon each year. The previous year is reviewed with the student, and we expand upon their current interests to more precisely follow their career path. The year of academic courses, CTC programming, and the exposure in industry/post-secondary will assist in creating their more solid plan and forward thinking. The career plan allows for counselors, instructors, and other team members to gain information from the student and consolidate it in one location. The form can be referred to when preparing for IEP meetings, transition meetings, and conferences. The one-on-one conference provides an opportunity to check on areas such as the student's progress in all courses, post-secondary planning, financial aid applications, co-op opportunities, resume progress, portfolio progress, and job searches.

The students will prepare to be evaluated with their portfolio during their interview to prepare for the future co-op interview, scholarship interview, or fulltime position. During the senior year we review the final plan and portfolio before the students take the finished items home after graduation. In addition, more advanced resumes and letters are kept on the website for students to utilize after graduation for future employment purposes. These resources are reviewed in a classroom lesson.		
What process will be used for the student to present the information on their plan at various times (i.e. Exit Interview or other events)?	The students are advised to prepare the mock interview prep materials for the mock interview day with guest community employers. This includes their resume, cover letter, mock employment application, project pictures, and certifications that are placed in their portfolio. The students will prepare to be evaluated with their portfolio during their interview and obtain feedback. In addition, students are advised to use it for graduation projects at their sending schools.




