

COURSE ARTICULATION Between

HARRISBURG AREA COMMUNITY COLLEGE and Franklin County Career & Technology Center

In order to provide secondary school students with a continuum of education without unnecessary duplication of instruction and delay in attaining educational and career objectives, Harrisburg Area Community College and Franklin County Career & Technology Center have an Articulation Agreement. Students can receive college credit for work already completed at the secondary school level when they continue their education at HACC, Central Pennsylvania's Community College.

This is an articulation agreement for course(s) in the HVAC and Industrial Technology disciplines at HACC.

Based on the joint efforts of administration and staff at both institutions, it has been agreed that a majority of/or all competencies of the HACC courses listed below are delivered in similar or exact curriculum by the secondary school. This match of curriculum has resulted in the following option(s) for students:

Course Articulation where a specified standard of performance has been identified.

Terms: Students who matriculate into a curriculum at HACC within two years of having completed the program of study at the secondary school, at or above a specified performance standard, and submit proper documentation, may petition to receive HACC credit(s) in the course(s) listed below.

College in the High School where HACC's Shared Governance Procedure 701, Educational Offerings has been applied.

Terms: Students who apply to the college, register for the identified College in the High School course(s), and complete the course requirements will receive credit(s) and grade(s) in the course(s) listed below.

Tech Prep where an academic and technical program Scope and Sequence has been written.

Terms: Either course articulation or College in the High School may apply to a Tech Prep program of study. The Scope and Sequence will reflect that the courses listed below have been articulated between HACC and the secondary school, and that the student is following a Tech Prep program of study.

UPDATES: Updates are conducted every three years to confirm consistency of course content and program delivery. Changes in course content or program delivery at the secondary and/or post-secondary level require a joint meeting of designated personnel from each institution to determine modifications necessary if this amendment is to remain valid. *Where changes in curriculum or program no longer support the procedures for College in the High School, efforts will be made to continue the terms of this amendment as Course Articulation*




